THESE be the words which Moses spake unto all Israel on this side Jordan in the wilderness, in the plain over against the Red sea, between Paran, and Tophel, and Laban, and Hazeroth, and Dizahab.

2 (There are eleven days' journey from Horeb by the way of mount Seir unto Kadesh-barnea.)

S And it came to pass in the fortieth year, in the eleventh month, on the first day of the month, that Moses spake unto the children of Israel, according unto all that the LORD had given him in commandment unto them;

4 \*After he had slain Sihon the king of the Amorites, which dwelt in Heshbon, and Og the

king of Bashan, which dwelt at Astaroth in Edrei:

5 On this side Jordan, in the land of Moab, began Moses to declare this law, saying,

6 The Lord our God spake unto us in Horeb, saying, Ye have dwelt long enough in this saying, mount:

7 Turn you, and take your journey, and go to the mount of the Amorites, and unto 'all the places nigh thereunto, in the plain, in the hills, and in the vale, and in the south, and by the sea side, to the land of the Canaanites, and unto Lebanon,

unto the great river, the river Euphrates.

8 Behold, I have test the land before you: go in and possess the land which the Lord sware unto your fathers, \*Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, to give unto them and to their seed after them.

9 ¶ And I spake unto you at that time, saying, I am not able to bear you myself alone:

10 The Lord your God hath multiplied you, and, behold, ye are this day as the stars of heaven for

11 (The LORD God of your fathers make you a thousand times so many more as ye are, and bless

you, as he hath promised you!)
12 How can I myself alone bear your cumbrance,

and your burden, and your strife?

13 Take you wise men, and understanding, and known among your tribes, and I will make them rulers over you.

14 And ye answered me, and said, The thing

14 And ye answered me, and said, the thing which thou hast spoken is good for us to do.

15 So I took the chief of your tribes, wise men, and known, and 'made them heads over you, captains over thousands, and captains over hundreds, and captains over fifties, and captains over tens, and officers among your tribes.

16 And I charged your judges at that time, saying, Hear the causes between your brethren, and \*judge righteously between every man and his brother, and the stranger that is with him.

17 \*Ye shall not respect persons in judgment; but ye shall hear the small as well as the great; ye shall not be afraid of the face of man; for the judgment is God's: and the cause that is too hard for you, bring it unto me, and I will hear it.

18 And I commanded you at that time all the things which ye should do.

THESE be the words which Moses spake unto all Israel beyond Jordan in the wilderness, in the 1 Arabah over against 2 Suph, between Paran, and Tophel, and Laban, and Hazeroth, and Di-2 zahab. It is eleven days' journey from Horeb by the way of mount Seir unto Kadesh-barnea 3 And it came to pass in the fortieth year, in the R. V.

eleventh month, on the first day of the month, that Moses spake unto the children of Israel, according unto all that the Lord had given 4 him in commandment unto them; after he had

smitten Sihon the king of the Amorites, which dwelt in Heshbon, and Og the king of Bashan,

5 which dwelt in Ashtaroth, at Edrei: beyond Jordan, in the land of Moab, began Moses to 6 declare this law, saying, The Load our God spake unto us in Horeb, saying, Ye have dwelt 7 long enough in this mountain: turn you, and take your journey, and go to the hill country

of the Amorites, and unto all the places nigh

thereunto, in the Arabah, in the hill country, and in the lowland, and in the South, and by the sea shore, the land of the Canaanites, and Lebauon, as far as the great river, the river 8 Euphrates. Behold, I have set the land before you: go in and possess the land which the LORD sware unto your fathers, to Abraham, to Isaac,

and to Jacob, to give unto them and to their 9 seed after them. And I spake unto you at that time, saying, I am not able to bear you myself

10 alone: the Lord your God hath multiplied you, and, behold, ye are this day as the stars of 11 heaven for multitude. The Lorn, the God of your fathers, make you a thousand times so many more as ye are, and bless you, as he hath

12 promised you! How can I myself alone bear your cumbrance, and your burden, and your 13 strife? Take you wise men, and understanding,

and known, according to your tribes, and I will 14 make them heads over you. And ye answered

your tribes, wise men, and known, and made them heads over you, captains of thousands, and captains of hundreds, and captains of fifties, and captains of tens, and officers, according to

19 ¶ And when we departed from Horeb, we went through all that great and terrible wilderness, which ye saw by the way of the mountain of the Amorites, as the Lord our God commanded

ns; and we came to Kadesh-barnea.

20 And I said unto you, Ye are come unto the mountain of the Amorites, which the Lord our

God doth give unto us.

21 Behold, the Lord thy God hath set the land before thee: go up and possess it, as the Lord God of thy fathers hath said unto thee; fear not, neither be discouraged.

22 ¶ And yo came near unto me every one of you, and said, We will send men before us, and they shall search us out the land, and bring us word again by what way we must go up, and into what cities we shall come.

23 And the saying pleased me well: and \*I took

twelve men of you, one of a tribe:

24 And \* they turned and went up into the mountain, and came unto the valley of Eshcol, and searched it out.

25 And they took of the fruit of the land in their hands, and brought it down unto us, and brought us word again, and said, It is a good land which the Lord our God doth give us.

26 Notwithstanding ye would not go up, but rebelled against the commandment of the Lord your

God:

27 And ye murmured in your tents, and said, Because the Lord hated us, he hath brought us forth out of the land of Egypt, to deliver us into the

hand of the Amorites, to destroy us. 28 Whither shall we go up? our brethren have discouraged our heart, saying, The people is greater and taller than we; the cities are great and walled up to heaven; and moreover we have seen the sons of the \* Anakims there.

29 Then I said unto you, Dread not, neither be

afraid of them.

30 The Lord your God which goeth before you, he shall fight for you, according to all that he did for you in Egypt before your eyes; 31 And in the wilderness, where thou hast seen

how that the Lord thy God bare thee, as a man doth bear his son, in all the way that ye went, until ye came into this place.
32 Yet in thus thing ye did not believe the Lord

your God,
33 \* Who went in the way before you, to search you out a place to pitch your tents in, in fire by night, to shew you by what way ye should go, and in a cloud by day.

34 And the Lord heard the voice of your words,

and was wroth, and sware, saying,

35 \*Surely there shall not one of these men of this evil generation see that good land, which I

sware to give unto your fathers,
36 Save Caleb the son of Jephunneh; he shall see
it, and to him will I give the land that he hath
trodden upon, and to his children, because he hath

wholly followed the LORD. 37 \*Also the Lone was angry with me for your sakes, saying, \*Thou also shalt not go in thither.

38 But Joshua the son of Nun, which standeth

before thee, he shall go in thither: encourage him:

for he shall cause Israel to inherit it.

39 Moreover your little ones, which ye said should be a prey, and your children, which in that day had no knowledge between good and evil, they shall go in thither, and unto them will I give it, and they shall possess it.

40 But as for you, turn you, and take your journey into the wilderness by the way of the Red sea. 41 Then ye answered and said unto me, \* We have sinned against the Lorn, we will go up and fight, according to all that the LORD our God commanded us. And when yo had girded on every man his weapons of war, ye were ready to go up into the hill.

42 And the Lord said unto me, Say unto

And we journeyed from Horeb, and went through all that great and terrible wilderness which ye saw, by the way to the hill country of the Amorites, as the Lond our God commanded 20 us; and we came to Kadesh-barnea. And I said

unto you, Ye are come unto the hill country of the Amorites, which the Lond our God giveth

21 unto us. Behold, the Lord thy God hath set the land before thee: go up, take possession, as the Lorp, the God of thy fathers, hath spoken

22 unto thee; fear not, neither be dismayed. And ye came near unto me every one of you, and said, Let us send men before us, that they may search the land for us, and bring us word again of the way by which we must go up, and the 23 cities unto which we shall come. And the thing

pleased me well: and I took twelve men of you. 24 one man for every tribe: and they turned and went up into the mountain, and came unto the

25 valley of Eshcol, and spied it out. And they took of the fruit of the land in their hands, and brought it down unto us, and brought us word again, and said, It is a good land which the

26 Lord our God giveth unto us. Yet ye would not go up, but rebelled against the command-

27 ment of the Lord your God: and ye murmured in your tents, and said, Because the Loro hated us, he hath brought us forth out of the land of Egypt, to deliver us into the hand of the 28 Amorites, to destroy us. Whither are we going

up? our brethren have made our heart to melt, saying, The people is greater and taller than we; the cities are great and fenced up to heaven; and moreover we have seen the sons 29 of the Anakım there. Then I said unto you,

30 Dread not, neither be afraid of them. The LORD your God who goeth before you, he shall fight for you, according to all that he did for

31 you in Egypt before your eyes; and in the wilderness, where thou hast seen how that the Lord thy God bare thee, as a man doth bear his son, in all the way that ye went, until ye 32 came unto this place. Yet in this thing ye

33 did not believe the Lord your God, who went before you in the way, to seek you out a place to pitch your tents in, in fire by night, to shew you by what way ye should go, and in the cloud 34 by day. And the Lord heard the voice of your

35 words, and was wroth, and sware, saying, Surely there shall not one of these men of this evil generation see the good land, which I sware to

36 give unto your fathers, save Caleb the son of Jephanneh, he shall see it; and to him will I give the land that he hath trodden upon, and to his children: because he hath wholly followed

37 the Lord. Also the Lord was angry with me for your sakes, saying, Thou also shalt not go

38 in thither: Joshua the son of Nun, which standeth before thee, he shall go in thither: encourage thou him; for he shall cause Israel to in-

39 herit it. Moreover your little ones, which ye said should be a prey, and your children, which this day have no knowledge of good or evil, they shall go in thither, and unto them will I

40 give it, and they shall possess it. But as for you, turn you, and take your journey into the

41 wilderness by the way to the Red Sea. Then ye answered and said unto me, We have sinned against the Lord, we will go up and fight, according to all that the Lord our God commanded us. And ye girded on every man his weapons of war, and 2 were forward to go up into the 42 mountain. And the Lord said unto me, Say unto

43 So I spake unto you; and ye would not hear, but rebelled against the commandment of the Lord, and twent presumptuously up into the hill.

44 And the Amorites, which dwelt in that mountain, came out against you, and chased you, as bees do, and destroyed you in Seir, even unto Hormah. 45 And ye returned and wept before the LORD; but the Lorp would not hearken to your voice, nor give ear unto you.

46 So ye abode in Kadesh many days, according unto the days that ye abode there.

2 Then we turned, and took our journey into the wilderness by the way of the Red sea, as the Lord spake unto me: and we compassed mount Seir many days.

2 And the Lord spake unto me, saying,

3 Ye have compassed this mountain long enough:

turn you northward.

4 And command thou the people, saying, Ye are to pass through the coast of your brethren the children of Esau, which dwell in Seir; and they shall be afraid of you: take ye good heed unto yourselves therefore:

5 Meddle not with them; for I will not give you of their land, 'no, not so much as a foot breadth; \*because I have given mount Seir unto Esau for a

possession.

6 Ye shall buy meat of them for money, that ye may eat; and ye shall also buy water of them for money, that ye may drunk.

7 For the Lorp thy God hath blessed thee in all the works of thy hand: he knoweth thy walking through this great wilderness: these forty years the Lord thy God hath been with thee; thou hast lacked nothing.

8 And when we passed by from our brethren the children of Esau, which dwelt in Seir, through the way of the plain from Elath, and from Eziongaber, we turned and passed by the way of the

wilderness of Moab.

9 And the Lord said unto me, | Distress not the Moabites, neither contend with them in battle: for I will not give thee of their land for a possession; because I have given Ar unto the children of Lot for a possession.

10 The Emims dwelt therein in times past, a people great, and many, and tall, as the Anakims; 11 Which also were accounted giants, as the Anak-

ims; but the Moabites call them Emims.
12 \*The Horims also dwelt in Seir beforetime; but the children of Esau †succeeded them, when they had destroyed them from before them, and dwelt in their "stead; as Israel did unto the land of his possession, which the Lord gave unto

13 Now rise up, said I, and get you over \*the brook Zered. And we went over the brook brook Zered. Zered.

14 And the space in which we came from Kadeshbarnea, until we were come over the brook Zered, was thirty and eight years; until all the generation of the men of war were wasted out from among the host, as the Lord sware unto them.

15 For indeed the hand of the Lord was against them, to destroy them from among the host, until

they were consumed.

16 ¶ So it came to pass, when all the men of war were consumed and dead from among the people,

17 That the Lord spake unto me, saying, 18 Thou art to pass over through Ar, the coast of

Moab, this day

19 And when thou comest nigh over against the children of Ammon, distress them not, nor meddle with them: for I will not give thee of the land of the children of Ammon any possession; because I have given it unto the children of Lot for a possession.

them, Go not up, neither fight; for I am not among you; lest ye be smitten before your ene-43 mies. So I spake unto you, and ye hearkened not; but ye rebelled against the commandment of the Lord, and were presumptuous, and went

44 up into the mountain. And the Amorites, which dwelt in that mountain, came out against you, and chased you, as bees do, and beat you

45 down in Seir, even unto Hormah. And ye returned and wept before the Lorn; but the Lond hearkened not to your voice, nor gave ear

46 unto you. So ye abode in Kadesh many days, according unto the days that ye abode there.

Then we turned, and took our journey into the wilderness by the way to the Red Ses, as the Lord spake unto me: and we compassed 2 mount Seir many days. And the Lord spake 3 unto me, saying. Ye have compassed this mount-

4 ain long enough: turn you northward. And command thou the people, saying, Ye are to pass through the border of your brethren the children of Esau, which dwell in Seir; and they shall be afraid of you: take ye good heed

5 unto yourselves therefore: contend not with them; for I will not give you of their land, no, not so much as for the sole of the foot to tread on: because I have given mount Seir unto Esau

6 for a possession. Ye shall purchase food of them for money, that ye may eat; and ye shall also buy water of them for money, that ye may

7 drink. For the Lord thy God hath blessed thee in all the work of thy hand: he hath known thy walking through this great wilderness: these forty years the Lord thy God hath

8 been with thee; thou hast lacked nothing. So we passed by from our brethren the children of Esau, which dwell in Seir, from the way of the Arabah from Elath and from Ezion-geber.

And we turned and passed by the way of the 9 wilderness of Moab. And the Loro said unto me, Vex not Moab, neither contend with them in battle: for I will not give thee of his land for a possession; because I have given Ar unto 10 the children of Lot for a possession. (The Emim dwelt therein aforetime, a people great,

11 and many, and tall, as the Anakim: these also are accounted <sup>1</sup>Rephaim, as the Anakim; but 12 the Moabites call them Emim. The Horites

also dwelt in Seir aforetime, but the children of Esau succeeded them; and they destroyed them from before them, and dwelt in their stead; as Israel did unto the land of his pos-13 session, which the Lord gave unto them.) Now

rise up, and get you over the brook Zered. 14 And we went over the brook Zered. And the days in which we came from Kadesh-barnea, until we were come over the brook Zered, were thirty and eight years; until all the generation of the men of war were consumed from the midst of the camp, as the Lord sware unto

15 them. Moreover the hand of the Lord was against them, to destroy them from the midst of the camp, until they were consumed.

16 So it came to pass, when all the men of war were consumed and dead from among the 17 people, that the Lond spake unto me, saying, 18 Thou art this day to pass over Ar, the border

19 of Moab: and when thou comest nigh over against the children of Ammon, vex them not, nor contend with them: for I will not give thee of the land of the children of Ammon for a possession: because I have given it unto the children of Lot for a possession.

21 ¶ Rise ye up, take your journey, and pass over the river Arnon: behold, I have given into thine hand Sihon the Amorite, king of Heshbon, and his land: †begin to possess it, and contend with him in battle.

25 This day will I begin to put the dread of thee and the fear of thee upon the nations that are under the whole heaven, who shall hear report of thee, and shall tremble, and be in anguish because

of thee.

26 ¶ And I sent messengers out of the wilderness of Kedemoth unto Sihon king of Heshbon with

words of peace, saying,

27 \*Let me pass through thy land: I will go along by the high way, I will neither turn unto the right hand nor to the left.

28 Thou shalt sell me meat for money, that I may eat; and give me water for money, that I may drink: only I will pass through on my feet;

29 (As the children of Esau which dwell in Seir, and the Moabites which dwell in Ar, did unto me;) until I shall pass over Jordan into the land which

the Lord our God giveth us.

30 But Sihon king of Heshbon would not let us pass by him: for the Lord thy God hardened his spirit, and made his heart obstinate, that he might deliver him into thy hand, as appeareth this day.

31 And the Lord said unto me, Behold, I have begin to give Sihon and his land before thee: begin to possess, that thou mayest inherit his land. 32 \*Then Sihon came out against us, he and all

his people, to fight at Jahaz.

33 And the Lond our God delivered him before us; and we smote him, and his sons, and all his

people.

34 And we took all his cities at that time, and utterly destroyed the men, and the women, and the little ones, of every city, we left none to remain:

35 Only the cattle we took for a prey unto ourselves, and the spoil of the cities which we took.

selves, and the spoil of the cities which we took.

36 From Aroer, which is by the brink of the river of Arnon, and from the city that is by the river, even unto Gilead, there was not one city too strong for us: the Lord our God delivered all unto us:

37 Only unto the land of the children of Ammon thou camest not, nor unto any place of the river Jabbok, nor unto the cities in the mountains, nor unto whatsoever the Lozn our God forbad us.

3 Then we turned, and went up the way to Bashan: and \*Og the king of Bashan came out against us, he and all his people, to battle at Edrei.

2 And the Lond said unto me, Fear him not: for I will deliver him, and all his people, and his land, into thy hand; and thou shalt do unto him as thou didst unto "Sihon king of the Amorites, which dwelt at Heshbon.

3 So the Lond our God delivered into our hands \*Og also, the king of Bashan, and all his people: and we smote him until none was left to him remaining.

4 And we took all his cities at that time, there was not a city which we took not from them, three-score cities, all the region of Argob, the kingdom of Og in Bashan.

20 (That also is accounted a land of Rephaim: Rephaim dwelt therein aforetime; but the Am-

21 monites call them Zamzummin; a people great, and many, and tall, as the Anakin; but the Loan destroyed them before them; and they succeeded 22 them, and dwelt in their steed; as he did for

22 them, and dwelt in their stead: as he did for the children of Esan, which dwell in Seir, when he destroyed the Horites from before them; and they succeeded them, and dwelt in their stead

23 even unto this day: and the Avvim which dwelt in villages as far as Gaza, the Caphtorim, which came forth out of Caphtor, destroyed them, and

24 dwelt in their stead.) Rise ye up, take your journey, and pass over the valley of Arnon: behold, I have given into thine hand Sihon the Amorite, king of Heshbon, and his land: begin to possess

25 it, and contend with him in battle. This day will I begin to put the dread of thee and the fear of thee upon the peoples that are under the whole heaven, who shall hear the report of thee, and shall tremble, and be in anguish because of thee.

26 And I sent messengers out of the wilderness of Kedemoth unto Sihon king of Heshbon with 27 words of peace, saying, Let me pass through thy land: I will go ¹along by the high way, I

will neither turn into the right hand nor to the 28 left. Thou shalt sell me food for money, that I may eat; and give me water for money, that I may drink: only let me pass through on my

29 feet; as the children of Esau which dwell in Seur, and the Moabites which dwell in Ar, did unto me; until I shall pass over Jordan into the land which the Lord our God giveth us.

30 But Sihon king of Heshbon would not let us pass by him: for the Lord thy God hardened his spirit, and made his heart 20bstinate, that he might deliver him into thy hand, as at this

31 day. And the Loan said unto me, Behold, I have begun to deliver up Sihon and his land before thee: begun to possess, that thou mayest

32 inherit his land. Then Sihon came out against us, he and all his people, unto battle at Jahaz. 33 And the Lond our God delivered him up before

us; and we smote him, and his \*sons, and all 34 his people. And we took all his cities at that time, and \*utterly destroyed every binhabited

time, and autterly destroyed every inhabited city, with the women and the little ones; we 35 left none remaining: only the cattle we took

for a prey unto ourselves, with the spoil of the 36 cities which we had taken. From Aroer, which is on the edge of the valley of Arnon, and from the city that is in the valley, even unto Gilead, there was not a city too high for us: the Lond 37 our God delivered up all before us: only to the

land of the children of Ammon thou camest not near; all the side of the river Jabbok, and the cities of the hill country, and wheresoever the Lord our God forbad us.

3 Then we turned, and went up the way to Bashan: and Og the king of Bashan came out against us, he and all his people, unto battle at

2 Edrei. And the Loap said unto me, Fear him not: for I have delivered him, and all his people, and his land, into thy hand; and thou shalt do unto him as thou didst unto Sihon king of

3 the Amorites, which dwelt at Heshbon. So the Lorn our God delivered into our hand Og also, the king of Bashan, and all his people: and we smote him until none was left to him 4 remaining. And we took all his cities at

4 remaining. And we took all his cities at that time; there was not a city which we took not from them; threescore cities, all the region of Argob, the kingdom of Og in Bashan. R.V.

A.V. 5 All these cities were fenced with high walls, gates, and bars; beside unwalled towns a great many.

6 And we utterly destroyed them, as we did unto Sihon king of Heshbon, utterly destroying the men, women, and children, of every city.

7 But all the cattle, and the spoil of the cities, we took for a prey to ourselves.

8 And we took at that time out of the hand of the two kings of the Amorites the land that vas on this side Jordan, from the river of Arnon unto mount Hermon;

9 (Which Hermon the Sidonians call Sirion; and the Amorites call it Shenir;)

10 All the cities of the plain, and all Gilead, and all Bashan, unto Salchah and Edrei, cities of the kingdom of Og in Bashan.

13 And the rest of Gilead, and all Bashan, being the kingdom of Og, gave I unto the half tribe of Manasseh; all the region of Argob, with all Bashan, which was called the land of giants.

14 Jair the son of Manasseh took all the country of Argob unto the coasts of Geshuri and Maachathi; and called them after his own name, Bashan-

\*havoth-jair, unto this day. 15 And I gave Gilead unto Machir.

16 And unto the Reubemtes and unto the Gadites I gave from Gilead even unto the river Arnon half the valley, and the border even unto the river Jabbok, which is the border of the children of Ammon;

17 The plain also, and Jordan, and the coast thereof, from Chinnereth even unto the sea of the plain, even the salt sea, under Ashdoth-pisgah

eastward.

18 ¶ And I commanded you at that time, saying, The Lord your God hath given you this land to possess it: \*ye shall pass over armed before your brethren the children of Israel, all that are † meet for the war.

19 But your wives, and your little ones, and your cattle, (for I know that ye have much cattle,) shall abide in your cities which I have given you.

20 Until the Lord have given rest unto your brethren, as well as unto you, and until they also possess the land which the Lord your God hath given them beyond Jordan: and then shall ye \*return every man unto his possession, which I have given you.

21 ¶ And \*I commanded Joshua at that time, saying, Thine eyes have seen all that the Lond your God hath done unto these two kings: so shall the Lond do unto all the kingdoms whither thou passest.

5 All these were cities fenced with high walls, gates, and bars; beside the lunwalled towns

cattle, and the spoil of the cities, we took for 8 a prey unto ourselves. And we took the land at that time out of the hand of the two kings of the Amorites that were beyond Jordan, from the valley of Arnon unto mount Hermon; 9 (which Hermon the Sidonians call Sirion, and

10 the Amorites call it Senu;) all the cities of the \*plain, and all Gilead, and all Bashan, unto Salecah and Edrei, cities of the kingdom of Og

11 in Bashan. (For only Og king of Bashan remained of the remnant of the Rephaim; behold, his bedstead was a bedstead of iron; is it not in Rabbah of the children of Ammon? nine cubits was the length thereof, and four cubits the breadth of it, after the cubit of a man)

12 And this land we took in possession at that time: from Aroer, which is by the valley of Arnon, and half the hill country of Gilead, and the cities thereof, gave I unto the Reubenites

13 and to the Gadites: and the rest of Gilead, and all Bashan, the kingdom of Og, gave I unto the half tribe of Manasseh; <sup>5</sup>all the region of Argob, <sup>6</sup>even all Bashan. (The same is called the

14 land of Rephaim. Jair the son of Manasseh took all the region of Argob, unto the border of the Geshurites and the Macathites; and called them, even Bashan, 7 after his own name, Hav-

15 voth jair, unto this day) And I gave Gilead 16 unto Machir. And unto the Reubenites and unto the Gadites I gave from Gilead even unto the valley of Arnon, the middle of the valley, and the border thereof; even unto the river Jabbok, which is the border of the children of

17 Ammon; the Arabah also, and Jordan <sup>8</sup> and the border thereof, from Chinnereth even unto the sea of the Arabah, the Salt Sea, under the <sup>9</sup> alopes of Pisgah eastward.

18 And I commanded you at that time, saying,
The Lord your God hath given you this land
to possess it: ye shall pass over armed before

your brethren the children of Israel, all the 19 men of valour. But your wives, and your little ones, and your cattle, (I know that ye have much cattle,) shall abide in your cities which I

4 The Lord talked with you face to face in the mount out of the midst of the fire,

into the mount;) saying,

thee out of the land of Egypt, from the house of

11 Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain: for the LORD will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name in vain. 12 Keep the sabbath day to sanctify it, as the

43 he might live: namely, Bezer in the wilderness, in the 1 plain country, for the Reubenites; and Ramoth in Gilead, for the Gadites; and Golan in Bashau, for the Manassites.

And this is the law which Moses set before 45 the children of Israel: these are the testimonies, and the statutes, and the judgements, which Moses spake unto the children of Israel,

46 when they came forth out of Egypt; beyond Jordan, in the valley over against Beth-peor, in the land of Sihon king of the Amorites, who dwelt at Heshbon, whom Moses and the children of Israel smote, when they came forth out

47 of Egypt: and they took his land in possession, and the land of Og king of Bashan, the two kings of the Amorites, which were beyond

48 Jordan toward the sunrising; from Aroer, which is on the edge of the valley of Arnon, even unto 49 mount Sion (the same is Hermon), and all the

Arabah beyond Jordan eastward, even unto the sea of the Arabah, under the 2 slopes of Pisgah.

And Moses called unto all Israel, and said unto them, Hear, O Israel, the statutes and the judgements which I speak in your ears this day, that ye may learn them, and observe to do 2 them. The Lord our God made a covenant 3 with us in Horeb. The Lord made not this covenant with our fathers, but with us, even 4 us, who are all of us here alive this day. The LORD spake with you face to face in the mount

5 out of the midst of the fire, (I stood between the Lord and you at that time, to shew you the word of the Lond: for ye were afraid because of the fire, and went not up into the mount;) saying,

BI am the LORD thy God, which brought thee out of the land of Egypt, out of the house

of 4bondage.

Thou shalt have none other gods 5 before me. Thou shalt not make unto thee a graven image, the likeness of any form that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that 9 is in the water under the earth: thou shalt not bow down thyself unto them, nor serve them: for I the Lond thy God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children, and upon the third and upon the fourth 10 generation of them that hate me; and shewing mercy unto 6thousands, of them that love me

and keep my commandments. Thou shalt not take the name of the LORD thy God 7 in vain: for the Long will not hold him guiltless that taketh his name 7in vain.

Observe the sabbath day, to keep it holy, as 13 the Lord thy God commanded thee. Six days 14 shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: but the seventh day is a sabbath unto the Loro thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, nor thy manR.V.

7 ¶ If there be among you a poor man of one of thy brethren within any of thy gates in thy land which the Lord thy God giveth thee, thou shalt not harden thine heart, nor shut thine hand from

thy poor brother:
8 \*But thou shalt open thine hand wide unto him, and shalt surely lend him sufficient for his need, in that which he wanteth.

9 Beware that there be not a thought in thy 'wicked heart, saying, The seventh year, the year of release, is at hand; and thine eye be evil against thy poor brother, and thou givest him nought; and he cry unto the Lord against thee, and it be sin unto thee.

10 Thou shalt surely give him, and thine heart shall not be grieved when thou givest unto him: because that for this thing the Loap thy God shall bless thee in all thy works, and in all that thou puttest thine hand unto.

11 For the poor shall never cease out of the land: therefore I command thee, saying, Thou shalt open thine hand wide unto thy brother, to thy poor, and

2 ¶ If there be found among you, within any of thy gates which the Lord thy God giveth thee, man or woman, that bath wrought wickedness in the sight of the Lord thy God, in transgressing his covenant,

3 And hath gone and served other gods, and worshipped them, either the sun, or moon, or any of the host of heaven, which I have not commanded:

4 And it be told thee, and thou hast heard of it, and enquired diligently, and, behold, it be true, and the thing certain, that such abomination is wrought in Israel:

5 Then shalt thou bring forth that man or that woman, which have committed that wicked thing, unto thy gates, even that man or that woman, and shalt stone them with stones, till they die.

6 \*At the mouth of two witnesses, or three witnesses, shall he that is worthy of death be put to death; but at the mouth of one witness he shall not be put to death.

7 The hands of the witnesses shall be first upon him to put him to death, and afterward the hands of all the people. So thou shalt put the evil away

from among you. 8 ¶ If there arise a matter too hard for thee in judgment, between blood and blood, between plea and plea, and between stroke and stroke, being matters of controversy within thy gates: then
